



PPEC Enrollment Policy

Pikes Peak Early College is an early college high school delivered through a hybrid learning environment. The school is a 100 percent school of choice with an enrollment pathway that is different from traditional District 49 schools. PPEC potential student enrollments should understand that this is a rigorous academic environment which supports individualized learning, mixtures of college and high school courses to ensure college, and career readiness. High School diplomas are not the primary goal of this school; it is a focus on associate's degrees, credit transfers to four-year universities and post-secondary certifications.

Students enrolling at PPEC must have access to high speed, reliable internet, and a computer. All students will have access to computers/iPads when in the building for instruction. Students may check out a school computer to use during the school year. Families seeking free and reduced benefits must submit official paperwork to be considered for computer use beyond the campus.

Admission and Entrance Requirements

Parents must attend an Enrollment Information Night or view our [presentation](#) prior to enrolling at PPEC. After attending, if you decide you want to enroll at PPEC and your student meets the criteria, you will need to complete the [PPEC Enrollment Steps](#). Once approved, families will receive a letter with further enrollment instructions.

Families who are transferring *from a D49 school* and are approved to enroll at PPEC will need to provide an updated proof of residence and a photo ID. All students transferring from a D49 school must withdraw from their previous school before we can complete your enrollment.

School Records
