- 6. District Accountability Committee (DAAC) report (Andrew) 8:55-9:00
 - a. Dave Watson gave a presentation on safety and security and the Raptor system in place now.
 - b. Tiffany is a member of the Family Engagement Committee and the committee would like her to share with the SAC about a program they have been trained on called FETS. It is a program that brings parents into their school for regular discussions. It has been successful in Boulder County.
 - c. The SAC needs to have their FAEL list ready for the March DAAC meeting, so we need to discuss it now, since we don't have a SAC meeting in March. It is the wish list of things our school would like to have if there is money left from MLO. We get 4-5 items. We can do the same as last year or change it up. If we put capital items, like the fencing, it will be grayed out but will remain on the list for the Board to see. An old list from 22-23 included 1. Safety and security 2. Curriculum materials 3. Ipad cases. FAEL stands for Financial Areas Emphasis List. They tell us to put details under each item, which they later move to another spot.

 - Tiffany emailed Dave Watson, who is over safety and security, about having a fence installed around the Odyssey playground. He emailed back that fencing to be installed around Odyssey is a reasonable request.
