- III. New Business
 - 1. Calendar set quarterly meetings

 - 4. 8/23 DAAC Report (Rob Eggert) District Accountability & Advisory Committee
 - a. What is it? Offers parents, students, other residents and staff of the district to become involved with the improvement of District 49.
 - b. Three presentations during the 8/23:



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- i. Lisa Fillo, UIP (Unified Improvement Plan) Direction and Timeline
 - 1. Ongoing document that schools use to meet the needs of our schools
 - 2. Envisio is the new system to keep the UIP and to make it more accessible to the public
 - 3. School Performance Framework (SPF) open to the public on August 29th (you can search your school on CDE to see how they rate)
 - 4. Local Accountability Metrics will be in the UIP for each school
 - Schools will add checklists on what schools will specifically do to increase Academics, Growth, Culture and Operations (the Local Accountability Measure main areas)
 - 6. Learning Services is working with schools to do a data dig on what their scores look like and then helping to make goals for the schools
- ii. Board Update: Jamilyn D'Avola
 - 1. One of the main priorities the BOE has is to increase teacher pay.
 - 2. Looking at cost effective programs with Social and Emotional Learning; regulating emotions, de-escalation
- iii. Andy Franko, Charter Applications and Subcommittee
 - 1. Application review no later than September 30th.
 - 2. New application vs. expansion. Schools are already in existence adding more grades
- 5. New staff members / re-distribution of positions
 - a. Tiffany Baumann (Math teacher)
 - b. Wendy Barnett (SPED paraprofessional)
 - c. Connor Cox (Armed security)
 - d. Tamarra Hardin (Psychologist itinerant)
- 6. Grant-funded initiatives
 - a. ESSER funds (\$10,000 from CDE through the AEC principal cohort)
 - i. \$5000 for 4 teachers (\$1250 each) to develop <u>project-based lessons</u> for their classes
 - ii. \$2000 to cover the benefits for those extra stipends
 - iii. \$3000 for both PHS administrators to attend the NAEA (National Alternative Education Association) convention in St. Louis during October Break
- 7. Unified Improvement Plan (UIP) for review and approval approved 8-0
 - a. Current goals
 - i. Raise reading, writing, and math skills through <u>increased</u> intervention classes (M-Th) and <u>focus groups</u> on Fridays.
 - 1. Average BOY reading level (all grades) for PHS: 7th-8th grade



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- 2. Average BOY math level (all grades) for PHS: 6th-7th grade
- 3. Last year's growth rate in math: 62.6% District, 56.7% D49 High Schools, 47.4% PHS
- 4. Last year's growth rate in reading: 63.8% D49, 60.2% D49 High Schools, 75.9% PHS
- ii. Increase the success rate of "credit recovery" courses (Edgenuity) by offering more guided Study Hall periods (M-Th) and Friday tutoring and a proactive monitoring system.
 - 1. Completion rate last year: 73%
- iii. Individual Career & Academic Plan (ICAP) completion for all grade-levels through an increased exposure to career speakers AND new quarterly post-secondary themed classes.
- iv. Use research-based "trauma-informed" instructional techniques to improve our student culture and minimize the amount of <u>dysregulation</u> seen among students, thus improving student achievement and stress tolerance.
 - 1. Last year's "positivity score" was 70%
 - 2. We scored in the 50th percentile of all Colorado Alternative Educational Campuses (AECs)
- b. Metrics for goals
 - i. Raise growth in math from 47.4% to 65% [from STAR 360 Math]
 - ii. Raise reading <u>proficiency</u> from 18.9% to 30% (proficiency = on grade level or above) [from STAR 360 Reading]
 - iii. Writing proficiency rate of 45% on benchmark assessments [from ThinkCERCA]
 - iv. Credit recovery completion rates raise from 73% to 90%
 - v. 95% of PHS students complete their ICAP requirements for the year
 - vi. Our "positivity score" rises from 70% to 80% [from CDE's "SEL & School Climate Survey for AECs"]
