## **First Quarter Discoveries News**

In Movement & Wellness class (aka PE), the students are working very hard learning and/or mastering skills. So far, we've practiced dribbling, throwing, climbing, running, gymnastics, kicking, punting, balance, and more. The students completed their first round of the PACER test last week giving us a baseline score. In this test, students try to run as many laps as they can in increasingly shorter intervals of time. The goal is to improve on the first test score. Students will have all year to practice in gym class, and practice outside the classroom is encouraged, but this test is not one to worry about and other test options are available. On the wellness front, we have been learning about growth mindsets and how challenging tasks help our brain grow.

This quarter in music class, our kindergarteners practiced keeping a steady beat and safely using instruments. In first grade, we continued to build our rhythm-reading skills, and explored musical extremes (high and low, loud and soft). Second grade has continued to work on understanding the difference between beat and rhythm, and how to play an ostinato. 3rd grade has been playing music with more than one part happening simultaneously, while 4th grade learned to compose music for multiple instruments. 5th grade has recently worked on some original compositions as well, and are now choosing and performing instrumental solos for the class. It has been a busy quarter in the music room, that is for certain!

The first quarter in the Library has been full of Book Joy! All of our students have been learning how to navigate the library and choose the "right book for right now". Kindergarteners spent their time with a read-aloud and center activities, working on communication and problem solving skills. 1st and 2nd graders learned about each section of the library and continued exploring through read-alouds and center activities. Our 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders have been building reading stamina and learning more about themselves as readers. Each student has been building a "Reader Profile" including favorite books, genres, amount of time they choose to spend reading, and their other interests. Reader Profiles will be used to track book selections and guide recommendations throughout the year. 5th Grade Leaders chose to work on student-led projects including comic book creation, several novels in progress, picture book-themed projects prepared to share with K-2

Our team and our students are all very excited to welcome Ms. Mathewson to the Discoveries team as our new art teacher! We look forward to sharing more about what your students learn in art in our update for Quarter 2!

## PowerSchool Parent Portal - Account Creation Guide

PowerSchool is the District's web-based tool providing real-time insights on student grades, schedules, performance, and attendance.

Before you can access your student information, you must create a new parent account (existing IC accounts will not work in PowerSchool).

You need to have at least one student Access ID and Password to create an account. If you have multiple students in our district, you should have received an email for each of those students with an Access ID and Password to link each of your students as you create the account.

If you did not receive an email containing the Access ID and Access Password(case sensitive), please contact your student's school to obtain this information.
