Before Thanksgiving Break, teachers included a message I had written specifically regarding student behaviors. This focused on students:

- being rested,
- · understanding routines,
- using positive words,
- and never hitting or kicking in school.

On Monday, our Zone Superintendent, Theresa Ritz, also sent out an email regarding student behaviors. Her themes included:

- Schools are expected to maintain high expectations for all students and hold students appropriately accountable for actions that are disruptive, detrimental, unsafe and inappropriate for school.
- It is important that parents/caregivers are aware of these expectations so that you can reinforce and support teacher and administrator actions.

We know that elementary students struggle at times. This is their first step in school as they work toward growing up and eventual high school graduation. The vast, vast majority of our students are positive classroom citizens. However, if a child is having deep, continuous struggles after these four months, we will continue to prioritize a safe and positive learning environment for all our kids. Consequences will occur. Student removal or suspensions are a last resort, but they may be necessary to ensure all students have a structured learning environment.



Note from our Social Worker - Mrs. Mackenzie Whitaker

You may feel that your child sometimes needs a mindfulness break during their day. This could be done when they seem escalated, after a difficult activity, or even at a time when they are calm and you want to maintain that. Try this: focus on the 5 senses by asking your child to think about one thing they feel, one thing they see, one thing they hear, one thing they smell, and one thing they taste. You could keep the activity very short by telling them just to think it in their heads, or they could write about it or draw about it with you. This activity is meant to ground your child and help them to have a calm mind and body.

PowerSchool is the District's web-based tool providing real-time insights on student grades, schedules, performance, and attendance

Before you can access your student information, you must create a new parent account (existing IC accounts will not work in PowerSchool).

You need to have at least one student Access ID and Password to create an account. If you have multiple students in our district, you should have received an email for each of those students with an Access ID and Password to link each of your students as you create the account.

If you did not receive an email containing the Access ID and Access Password(case sensitive), please contact your student's school to obtain this information.
