A note from the health room:

As we approach cold and flu season please review the following illness guidance regarding fevers at school and the district medication policy. Falcon School District 49 is following the Illness Guidelines from the Colorado Department of Public Health & Children's Hospital Colorado. Please refer to the full guidelines posted here <u>How Sick is Too Sick?</u>

Symptom/Síntoma Should your child stay home?/Si su hija/hijo se queda en casa?

Fever

Fever is a temperature of 100.4°F or greater. Babies who are 3 months or younger need to see a health care provider right away for a fever of 100°F or higher. Call your health care provider for any fever in an infant aged 6 months or younger.

Yes – The child or staff member may return to school or child care if the fever has been resolved for 24 hours (without fever-reducing medications) unless the fever is caused by an illness that requires them to stay home longer.

If the fever is consistent with the usual symptoms of a known chronic condition and the person is otherwise well enough to return to school, no further evaluation is necessary.

A temporary, elevated temperature due to overexertion or overdress, without other symptoms of illness, should not be considered a fever.

Fiebre

La fiebre es una

temperatura de 100.4°F o mayor. Si su bebé de 3 meses o menos tiene fiebre mayor a 100°F debe consultar de inmediato a un médico. Llame a su proveedor de atención médica en caso de que un bebé de 6 meses o menos tenga fiebre.

Sí - El niño o el miembro del personal pueden volver a la escuela o a la guardería si la fiebre se ha resuelto en un plazo de 24 horas sin ingerir medicamentos antifebriles (a menos que la fiebre esté causada por una enfermedad que requiera que permanezcan en casa más tiempo).

Si la fiebre encuadra con los síntomas habituales de una enfermedad crónica conocida y la persona se halla lo suficientemente bien como para volver a la escuela, no es necesaria realizar ninguna otra evaluación.

Una temperatura corporal elevada de carácter temporario debida a un sobreesfuerzo o a un exceso de ropa, sin otros síntomas de enfermedad, no debe considerarse fiebre.



PowerSchool Parent Portal: Account Creation Guide Get Started (pdf version of instructions)

PowerSchool is the District's web-based tool providing real-time insights on student grades, schedules, performance, and attendance.

Before you can access your student information, you must create a new parent account (existing IC accounts will not work in PowerSchool).

You need to have at least one student Access ID and Password to create an account. If you have multiple students in our district, you should have received an email for each of those students with an Access ID and Password to link each of your students as you create the account.

If you did not receive an email containing the Access ID and Access Password(case sensitive), please contact your student's school to obtain this information.
