BACKGROUND INFORMATION, DESCRIPTION OF NEED: The Colorado Department of Education recently released Preliminary District and School Performance Framework reports to districts in Colorado. Frameworks include indicators of performance in the areas of Finance, Safety, Test Participation, Academic Achievement, Academic Growth, and Post Secondary Work Force Readiness (high school). The District's and each school's preliminary rating suggests the accreditation and plan type assigned for improvement planning and accountability purposes. Districts are accredited by the State Board of Education with distinction, or with a performance, improvement, priority improvement or turnaround plan type. Schools are assigned a performance, improvement, priority improvement or a turnaround plan type, but are accredited by the local Board of Education.

RATIONALE: District 49 will continue to offer accredited schools and use the District and School Performance Frameworks as tools to improve student achievement.

RELEVANT DATA AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES: Review preliminary results. Consider request to reconsider process.

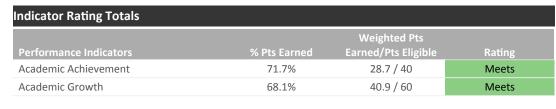

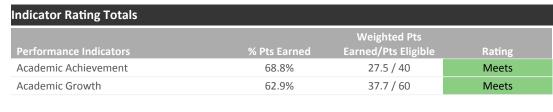

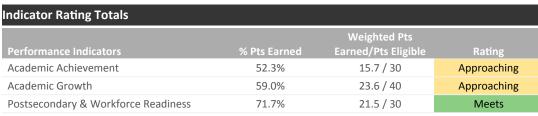
