## **BACKGROUND INFORMATION, DESCRIPTION OF NEED:**

On January 12, 2017, the Board of Education conditionally approved the charter application for the Colorado Military Academy. Since that time, administration has worked closely with the applicant to develop a viable school that is set to open in August of 2017. Unique to this project is the proposed location of the school. While District 49 has approved the application, the proposed facility resides in Colorado Springs School District 11. Because of the location, an agreement between the districts and the applicant is needed. Recently, District 11 has made the applicant and District 49 administration aware that it intends to support the charter school through an approval process with the Charter School Institute, not District 49. District 49 was not made aware of the resolution passed by the District 11 Board of Education and so continued to work towards an agreement. Given this information, the Colorado Military Academy has made it known to District 11 and District 49 administration that they will move the application to the Charter School Institute.

## **RATIONALE:**

Because District 49 wishes to support the families who have committed to the Colorado Military Academy and maintain a positive relationship with the neighboring school district, administration recommends the Board of Education resolve to rescind the conditional approval of the Colorado Military Academy charter application.

### RELEVANT DATA AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

The Colorado Military Academy will have the opportunity to apply to the Charter School Institute and if approved, open the school as planned in the Fall of 2017.

## Regarding Colorado Military Academy

The Board of Education is committed to Every Student by conditionally approving the charter application for the Colorado Military Academy; and

The Board of Education learned from its Community partner, Colorado Springs School District 11, that the release of the application from its exclusive chartering authority was intentionally done so that the Colorado Military Academy could pursue authorization from the Colorado Charter School Institute; and

The Board of Education is committed to seeing the families of the Colorado Military Academy best served;

#### THEREFORE:

We, the members of the board, resolve to rescind the conditional acceptance of the Colorado Military Academy as approved by a 5-0 vote on January 12, 2017. The rescinding of the charter approval releases District 49 authority of the Colorado Military Academy, thus opening the opportunity for the applicant to pursue a partnership with the Colorado Charter School Institute.

The Chief Education Officer, through his designee, the iConnect Zone Superintendent, will be responsible for appropriate support of the Colorado Military Academy and the District 49 families the school intends to serve.
