<u>TITLE OF AGENDA ITEM:</u> PTAA – Request for off-cycle charter application review

ACTION/INFORMATION/DISCUSSION: Action

BACKGROUND INFORMATION: DESCRIPTION OF EXPECTATION/NEED/ OPPORTUNITY:

Pioneer Technology and Arts Academy applied for and was denied approval for a charter in the Spring of 2019 application cycle. The applicant is interested in applying during the 2019-20 school year with a new application. They are requesting the application be reviewed prior to the Spring cycle.

RATIONALE:

An off-cycle review of a charter application can be conducted if agreed upon by both the applicant board and the authorizing board. An off-cycle review would allow PTAA the opportunity to improve the application, connect deeply with the D49 community, and work to gain a viable facility solution for the potential school.

RELEVANT DATA AND EXPECTED OUTCOMES:

The off-cycle review would commence in the fall of 2019. D49 Board of Education is requested to take action on the application in December of 2019. While PTAA is requesting a Fall 2020 opening, D49 administration will make a recommendation for opening should the application warrant a recommendation for approval.

INNOVATION AND INTELLIGENT RISK:

D49 has conducted off-cycle reviews in the past. This application has potential to support the portfolio of schools within the District.

Regarding Charter School Application – Off-cycle Application Review

The Board of Education is committed to Every Student by supporting Charter Schools as an avenue of serving student needs, promoting high academic expectations, and embracing a culture of innovation; and

The Board of Education is committed to providing a Portfolio of Schools – to include Charter School options; and

The Board of Education is committed to being the Best District by supporting the diverse needs of students through innovation and specialized programming emphasizing Character Education; Early Literacy; Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, and Mathematics (STEAM); Post-Secondary and Workforce readiness; and

The Board of Education is committed to building strong Community partnerships with both local charter boards and state and national agencies such as the National and Colorado Association of Charter School Authorizers, and the Colorado League of Charter School; and

The Board of Education is committed to building Trust by offering a quality chartering opportunities, which will attract and retain students in D49; and

The Board of Education is committed to building Trust by ensuring a quality review of charter applications is conducted by the District Accountability Committee, District Administration, and an external panel of experts, and is voted on by experienced board members;

THEREFORE:

We, the members of the board, resolve to support the request of Pioneer Technology and Arts Academy (PTAA) for a waiver of Colorado Revised Statute 22-30.5.107(1)(b), which states: "The local board of education shall receive and review all application for charter schools. If the local board of education does not review a charter application, it shall be deemed to have denied the charter application. A charter application must file its application with the local board of education by ta date determined by the local board of education to be eligible for consideration for the following school year. An application is considered filed when the school district administration receives the charter application from the charter applicant either in hard copy or electronically. The date determined by the local board of education for filing applications shall not be any earlier than August 1 or any later than October 1. Prior to any change in the application deadline, the local board of education shall notify the department and each charter school applicant in the district of the proposed changed by certified letter. The local board of education shall not charge any application fee."

RATIONALE:

By mutual agreement, District 49 and PTAA agree to cooperate in an off-cycle review of the charter application following the review process as set by the school district.
