Ms. Kassi's 2/3 Class

This week in Social Studies we will learn about Roman Emperors, specifically Caesar Augustus and the tale of Julius Caesar's rise to power. Since the Empire grew with the system of roads primarily built by the army, we will be making our own mini Roman roads this week as well. For our Roman roads we are in great need of cracker or cereal boxes if your family can send some in this week.

In science, we will learn about chemical changes to matter. We will be creating a chemical reaction with baking soda and vinegar within baggies.

Also, the week of 5/7-5/9 we will be completing a final states of matter activity using smores. We will be making smores in class to watch the physical and chemical changes to each ingredient. Homeschool Helpful Tips Looking Ahead to Next Year: Part 4- Challenges to tackle: Personality and Learning Styles

Welcome FHP families to our series on looking ahead to next year! The next few weeks, we are looking at challenges you may have had in your homeschool this year and how to reflect, problem solve, and create changes for next year.

This week we will focus on the most common homeschool challenge: **Personality and Learning Style Differences.** Reflection questions and thoughts to consider.

-As the homeschool parent, have I reflected on my children's and my own personality or learning style and how differences may cause challenges?

-Am I too flexible with a child that needs structure?

-Am I too rigid with a child that needs to have more choices in their day?

-Am I remembering the school day does not have to look exactly the same for each of my children? -Could I make changes to our schedule to help our day run smoother?

-Do I need to change the environment to support each of my children? (headphones for concentration, learning walls to limit visual distractions, soft seating, exercise balls). -Can I allow my students different ways to show their learning (speeches, art, dictation)?
