Homeschool Helpful Tips Looking Ahead to Next Year: Part 5- Challenges to tackle: Could my child have a Disability?

This week we will focus on a common homeschool question: **Could my child have a learning disability?** 

Parents, you know your children best. If you have been concerned about one or more of your children having a learning disability here are some signs to look for and some resources to check out!

Early Warning Signs of a Learning Disability

- Pronunciation problems
- Slow vocabulary growth, often unable to find the right word
- Poor memory retention
- Late talking, compared to other children
- Trouble learning numbers, the alphabet, days of the week
- Extremely restless and easily distracted
- Trouble interacting with peers
- Poor ability to follow directions or routines

Steps for a Learning Disability Evaluation

STEP 1: Collect observations, notes, and details regarding the concern for your child

<u>STEP 2</u>: You can start by discussing your concerns with your pediatrician. Often they can refer you to a local provider that can further evaluate.

<u>STEP 3</u>: Have your child evaluated by a neuropsychological professional and receive report <u>STEP 4</u>: Find resources to support your child and yourself
