PROGRAM REMINDERS

New Field Trip Policy

IMPORTANT - We have a new policy for completing paperwork for field trips: First you must complete the survey that will be sent to you via email three to four weeks before the field trip. It lets us know if your child is attending and if your child needs a ride. Then we need your permission slip, and money; if money is needed, turn these in together. All of these steps need to happen before the field trip. Our teachers have put a lot of time and effort into finding wonderful field trips that go with their curriculum, that they feel their students will love and benefit from. We want all our students to experience our field trips.

However, our new policy is that all items are due no later than one week before the field trip: the survey, permission slip and money (if applicable). If those items don't get turned in one week prior, your child will not be able to attend the field trip. We will have a list on the board in the multipurpose room of all the upcoming field trip dates and what's needed for each one. Your child's teacher will also have due dates on their wipe boards outside their classrooms.

Spring Classroom Field Trips are Quickly Approaching - Have you completed a background check yet?

Field trips for our program depend on parent drivers and chaperones. If you would like to help out our program and volunteer, you will need to have a background check completed by District 49.

- If a background check is completed between July 1 and Feb 28, the background check is valid through June 30.
- If a background check is completed between March 1 and June 30, the background check is valid until June 30 of the following year.

Homeschool Helpful Tips

Looking Ahead to Next Year: Part 4- Challenges to tackle: I can't get my child to do school!

Welcome FHP families to our series on looking ahead to next year! The next few weeks, we are looking at challenges you may have had in your homeschool this year and how to reflect, problem solve, and create changes for next year.

This week we will focus on the most common homeschool challenge: **Children not wanting to do school**. Reflection questions and thoughts to consider.

- **-Is your curriculum too difficult or too hard?** Always look for curriculum that allows your students some challenges but also some successes.
- -Are you as the homeschool leader honoring your school day? Are you distracted by too many things going on (laundry, younger siblings, your phone...)?
- -Do you have solid routines and procedures in place so your children know what to expect?
- -Are aspects of your school day negotiable and not negotiable? Do your children understand areas of choice and areas they do not get to choose?
- -Are your words expressing the importance of your school day? I am so guilty of this in my homeschool years so absolutely NO judgment here! Are you saying things like, "Let's get finished with school so we can do some fun activities!" "You can play video games when you finish school." Remember phrases like this express to children that school is not fun and that it is something they may want to rush to finish. In our house to combat these phrases, I established a time, 2:00 pm in the afternoon so even if my children were finished with school they did not have choice time. They could read, play learning games, finish chores, etc. This helped my children honor their school day and not rush through their work.

Stay tuned next week when we discuss another common homeschool challenge!
