## **District Accountability Committee (Ryan Sherman):**

Going over budget priorities this month. All SACs need to endorse their school's UIP's prior to March 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting.

Three schools were awarded Every Student Succeeds Act Grant. Targeted for student needs around special education.

District is seeking an exception for Elementary schools to allow hiring of own substitutes without having to go through the State.

Safety coordinator for District (Sarah McAfee), looking into whether we've had more instances of illness with the removal of Clorox wipes. We do have replacement products we are using that are similar in nature. Amy Willis mentioned that it is the teacher's responsibility to clean the desks. That they used to get rags, but changed to paper towels. Thought might be good to take another look at that process too.

Current Survey online regarding Falcon District 49 is looking to change the name to Pikes Peak School District 49.

Jenny Betzmer asked about rebranding cost? There is some information on the survey regarding how they intend to handle the brand with wording primarily. Changes with branding would be minimal. Would not discard anything that currently exists with rebranding.

## CIA Update:

Last meeting February 1<sup>st</sup>. Great turnout with staff, need more parents to come. Update on vision work, with focus on 5 areas. Learning, Teaching, Leadership, Community, XXX. Want partnership with SAC. Used layout/format of our agenda for their agenda. In May they will decide if they want to continue to be CIA or go back to PTA.

Voted on what to do with \$1,500 in Box Top money – divvy out between teachers or use as CIA account. Unanimous to keep with CIA account. Talked about moving to have staff request money from CIA.

Planning on doing one fundraiser this year – Smencils.

Popcorn Friday's – teachers hung around and popped all the popcorn.

#### Principal Report (Sarah McAfee):

Next Steps and planning with CIA -

CIA through the end of the year, any activity fee has to go into D49 Finance department to be sure it's accounted for consistently with checks and balances.

Suggested having SAC representative with CIA/PTA representative at back to school night to allow parents to sign-up for either group depending on what items they want to be involved with.

This Friday they will communicate that they did purchase the playground equipment that was supposed to be purchased. Did so through taking some money from different line items to purchase playground equipment. \$1,000 out of library fund, some money from Instructor Staff Development and some money from general school supplies this year, and workbooks but allocated a little more to next year's budget – library for example (3B/3A money buckets).

Playground equipment was purchased on 2/9/18 – communicated two weeks to get equipment and install, so we should be seeing that by end of February. Sarah McAfee is trying to nail down a specific date. Hoping to have it in by Bingo for Books. Currently penciled in for March 2nd. Confirmation of payment went through.

Still have contingency in 3B meeting. Once building and furniture money is allocated that should take most of the money. Wonderful building and furniture companies (CDW) Sarah McAfee worked with were wonderful! Should have renderings for the next SAC meeting. Deadline 4-5 weeks out, have to meet March 20<sup>th</sup>.

Pictures of the inside of the building. Touring today. Start drywall next week. Framing right now. Over Spring Break, they will be cutting through window and make a lot of progress. They will have to board things up once students return.

Sarah McAfee said she is very impressed with the company. Stating they have been very informative, great communication. Colors that are currently be looked at – purple, yellow and accents; green and blue. Paint colors will be ready by Friday. Committee is meeting today @11:00 to finalize.

Amy Willis asked about colors transitioning into this building. They will be trying to have a transition over a period of time. Starting with refreshing yellow and then some accent colors.
