- Remember T1 is ending soon and many of you need your credit to graduate. Make sure you're passing all your classes.

Freshmen

- We finally have more clarity regarding graduation. You will need to obtain credits and show mastery. You can show mastery through the SAT, assessments in your classes or potentially through a project.
- You will need to shoot for Cs and better in all of your classes. With T1 ending soon make sure you have Cs or better to ensure you are working toward graduation.
- Counselors will meet with freshmen in November to clarify and answer questions.
