Meeting called to order: 4:28

Old Business:

 Tutoring Update-Ed reported that we had 5 teachers willing to tutor for struggling readers. Mrs. Owen, Mrs. Henderson, Mrs. Anderson, Mrs. Nidiffer, and Mrs. Rushing have all volunteered for every Tuesday and Thursday to tutor for an hour. We have 32 kids being tutored.

New Business:

- DAAC update-Kris reported that anyone is welcome to attend. There was an
 opportunity to give priority budget items. These would not be capital improvement
 items. He spoke with Ed and the things he sees are; purchasing the CKLA
 consumables, training staff members on math interventions, keeping literacy
 specialist. Jo recommended a science program. Belinda asked about a program that
 would help with organization and good study habits. Kris will bring the budget
 priority items to the DAAC.
- New Schools-Dr. Julia Roark shared the Organizational Plan for the new school. There will be an opportunity for parents to give feedback on the D49 website if they are unable to attend the community meetings. The hope is the new school will help alleviate the overcrowding. She stated that the caps would stay at 23 for K, 24 for 1st, 25 for 2nd, 26 for 3rd, 27 for 4th, and 28 for 5th. Julia shared the two ideas for the zone (see below). She will be brining these plans to the school board in April. She is trying to get feedback from the community now by sharing the plan now. Julia encouraged parents to attend the community meetings to share their ideas. Three options for overcrowding at the middle school; put 6th grade back to the elementary levels, purchase more modulars for the middle school, or the new school could house an elementary school (K-5) and all 6th graders. There is also a hybrid proposal that would have an executive principal oversee both the middle school and elementary school. Depending on future population growth, there are other possibilities. The district is also pursuing how you would draw boundaries for attendance to maximize educational space but also honor parents' wishes.
- MLO School Improvements (Ed) Mr. Kulbacki shared budgeting items that were approved for Mill-Levy Override projects. While there are other school needs

(parking lots and bus loops), they are cost-prohibitive compared to building needs and common areas used by kids. Ideas were shared on how to implement phonics, math, geography, and exercise when it came to capital improvements. Proposed MLO spending was approved by consensus.


