Dr. Pickering - Dashboard Report

- Dr. Pickering talked about the Power Zone dashboard. He talked about how schools will be held accountable and currently it is based on PARCC data.
- He is here to show that there may be other data points that might be more valuable to show how the school is doing.
- We asked SAC committees, Staff and Students (Primarily at VRHS) what measurements would you want to see us use to show performance. They then voted on the six indicators.
 - Literacy
 - o POWER Pathways
 - Critical Thinking
 - Problem Solving
 - School Climate
 - Safety & Security
- Each school has their own scores in the 6 areas and then there is an overall score for the Power Zone. We have a website that we use that gives this information: pzinnovators.org
- The pathways should be used according to the students ICAP. We talk about the software that we are using to create those plans.
- What we are trying to do is move away from the School Performance Framework and move toward the POWER Dashboard
- Dr. Pickering models the website and shows how to get to each of the indicators and what data was used to gain that level in the indicator. Skyview is #2 out of 20 all of the middle school in Literacy Growth and # 1 in Special Education Growth in Literacy.
- We will be solidifying the data and models before the end of the year.
- A parent brought up Safety and Security.
 - Dr. Pickering talks about what was calculated in the Safety and Security. He also refers to the High Reliability Schools and how schools have been certified in 5 areas that make up that Safety and Security.
 - The second is the D49 Cultural Compass Survey- this is the survey that is given to the parent and students every year selected randomly.
- We are getting feedback from teachers and that deadline is April 27th to make the final changes for the model.
- Dr. Pickering wants to take this to the state to show them what we are using to give our schools
 a different performance model. SACs will have to vote to approve this model before it goes to
 the state.
